



ACCEPTABLE RECYCLABLES

MIXED PAPER

Newsprint and inserts, magazines, office paper, junk mail, catalogs, board (kitchen cardboard) envelopes, stationary

NOTE: For your own protection, do not place any personal papers like bank statements or credit card information in this container. Please dispose of them in the household trash for disposal

CARDBOARD

All cardboard boxes except foil face and wax coated cardboard. Please breakdown cardboard.

BRUSH

Clean brush and wood under 5" diameter.

FLUORESCENT TUBES (*Compact Bulbs*)

Please see attendant for proper packaging. Fluorescent tubes must not be broken.

COMMINGLED CONTAINERS

Steel cans, all colors of glass bottles, plastic containers marked (HDPE) #2 and (PETE) #1, all aluminum cans and beverage containers, crushed foil, crushed pie plates.

USED OIL

NO contaminated oil i.e. gasoline, antifreeze, solvents, water

USED ANTI-FREEZE

DO NOT mix with motor oil, solvents or any other contaminant

BATTERIES

Nicad rechargeable batteries, automotive wet cell batteries.

SCRAP METAL

Any light iron not contaminated with wood, rubber or plastic.

Refrigerators need to be kept aside for CFC removal. See attendant.

PROPANE TANKS

20# gas grill tanks and disposable hand held torch tanks. Please see attendant for proper disposal.

CONSTRUCTION & DEMOLITION DEBRIS

Debris including brick and concrete, asphalt shingles and tarpaper only. Insulation, plastic, steel or garbage will be deposited in their appropriate containers. **Absolutely no asbestos.**

THERE IS A FEE FOR THESE ITEMS

RUBBER TIRES

Automotive and truck tires, no tires with rims please.

LANDFILLED DEMOLITION

Fiberglass and styrofoam insulation, bulky items, i.e. couches and chairs, treated wood sheetrock, mattress and box springs.

THERE IS A FEE FOR THESE ITEMS

USED PAINT

will be collected during the annual Household Hazardous Waste Day.

CATHODE RAY TUBES

Computer and TV monitors

ELECTRONICS

VCRs, stereos, CD players, PC keyboards, computer hard drives, fax machines and copiers.

USED OIL FILTERS

Any "spin on" style drained oil filters from cars and trucks

COMPOST PILE

Leaves and grass clippings or any other yard wastes other than brush

TEXTILES

Any good used clothing or shoes (no under garments please)

MERCURY CONTAINING PRODUCTS

Thermostats, smoke detectors, thermometers, mercury switches.

HOLIDAY HOURS


The Transfer Station will be open Monday (Sunday operating hours) only on Memorial Day, Labor Day and Independence Day when it is observed on a Monday.


